

Sri Lanka, an island nation in the Indian Ocean, boasts a rich and ancient history that spans over 2,500 years. Its civilization dates back to the arrival of the Sinhalese people, who, according to legend, were descendants of India. Its earliest kingdoms date back to 377 BC. These early years of national history marked the beginning of cultural and architectural flourishing. These early kingdoms built impressive monuments like the Sigiriya rock fortress and the massive reservoirs and temples that are now UNESCO World Heritage sites.

Buddhism, introduced to the island in the 3rd century BC by the missionary Mahinda, became deeply intertwined with the culture, shaping Sri Lanka's art, literature, and traditions. The island also saw periods of Tamil rule in the north, as well as the spread of



Hinduism, creating a blend of religious practices.

Colonialism began with the Portuguese in the early 16th century, followed by the Dutch in the 17th century, and finally the British in the 19th century. British rule transformed Sri Lanka's economy, focusing on tea, rubber, and coconut plantations, while also intensifying ethnic and social divisions.

After gaining independence in 1948, Sri Lanka (then Ceylon) struggled with ethnic tensions between the Sinhalese majority and Tamil minority, leading to a devastating civil war filled with violence and terrorism from 1983 to 2009.

Today, Sri Lankan culture is a vibrant tapestry that reflects its religious heritage, colonial past, and diverse ethnic groups. Its unique place as the crossroads between the Buddhist and Hindu worlds has led to this strategic partnership.

or evangelical Christians, converting believers in Sri Lanka is challenging due to the country's strong religious and cultural identity. The majority Sinhalese population practices Buddhism, and Hinduism is prominent in the Tamil community. Both religions have deep-rooted traditions that shape daily life and social norms.

Evangelical efforts can be seen as a threat to the nation's spiritual heritage, often leading to resistance. Additionally, Sri Lanka's legal framework and occasional social pressures can hinder religious conversion.

Social stigmas, fear of ostracism, and interfaith tensions further complicate evangelical missions, making it difficult for Christian groups to gain acceptance or grow their following.

Despite the resistance and difficulties, there is a church that stands as a beacon of hope across much of the nation. People's Church in Colombo, Sri Lanka, is a prominent Christian congregation known for its vibrant worship and community outreach. Founded in the 1980s, it has grown to become one of the largest and most influential



evangelical churches in the country. The church focuses on preaching the Gospel, empowering individuals spiritually, and serving the local community through various social initiatives.

It offers programs that cater to youth, families, and the marginalized, aiming to address both spiritual and social needs. Despite the religious diversity in Sri Lanka, People's Church has gained a reputation for its commitment to faith, compassion, and social justice.

Under the direction of its lead pastor, Dishan Wickramaratne, this church has expanded from the urban city of Colombo to reach the many diverse regions of the nation. In 2025 People's Church plans on adding two more locations in Colombo and dozens more churches, house churches, and outreaches across the country. Each week thousands join for worship services, and they strive to touch double that number weekly through their many different outreach initiatives.

1. KIDS KLUBS

The first step in the vision strategy for People's church is centered on Kids Klub. This hour long program is opened to parents of all religions and teaches children character lessons that come directly from the Bible. Reaching the next generation is the key to winning Sri Lanka. People's church currently has over 5,000 children attending weekly Kid's Klub meetings.



3. CHURCH PLANTING

Church planting begins with small group Bible studies where, often families who have received care from the church come and hear biblical teaching. When a community has 2-3 Bible studies it is converted into a house church. A house church creates outreach initiatives and grows into a church that starts the vision process of outreach in a neighboring town. All church planting and campuses across the nation stem to the mother church in Colombo.

2. FEEDING PROGRAMS

Many children in inner cities and rural villages do not have a daily nutritious meal. People's church, with the help of their international partners, dig water wells and feed thousands of children each day in public schools. This has provided favor with school districts, parents, and government officials and gives the church its initial public witness to a community.



4. CHAMPIONS CLUB

Self-sustaining churches are incorporating
Champions Club, ministering to children and parents
of children with special needs. In Sri Lanka, other
religions project heavy condemnation on special
needs children and their parents. Champions
Club is an opportunity to show the special needs
community that Jesus loves them and cares for
them.
